- The Quogue Historic Garden: Doug Nappi of Dragonfly Landscape Design will present his first drawing to Barbara Sartorius; Chester Murray, Co-Chair of the Quogue Historical Society, Inger Mejean; Jessica Beccia; the 2019/20 Provisionals; Maryann Hill, Nada Isler, Susanne Jansson and Joan Reilly when it is safe to convene. Later, Jessica and the Provisionals with Inger will commence their summer-long care for this very precious group of four small gardens that Jessica has so ably shepherded for many years.
