This initiative is being led by a group of Provisional Members – Kelly Bennett, Lisa Chapman, Donna Levy, Peggy Veziris, and Alicia Whitaker, with support from Nancy Lombardi and Ki Nobiletti.

We will be ordering high quality bulbs from a wholesaler, potting them up in November and holding them in a greenhouse or our homes until distributing them in early December.
