

Plant list of the "Quogue Garden of Remembrance"

❖ **Agastache 'Blue Fortune'**

Anise Hyssop - 2.5' to 3' tall hybrid. Lavender color in full sun
Blooms mid. Summer - early Fall. **It is an Award-Winning Plant in the Netherlands. A pollinator magnet. Zones: 4-9**



Amsonia hubrichtii

Blue Star - 2' - 3' tall. Blue colored flower from mid. Spring to early Summer with deep green to bright yellow leaves in fall. Full sun to mostly sunny. Cut back 8" from ground in early Spring.

In 2011 chosen by the Perennial Plant Assoc. "Plant of the Year". A pollinator that helps to attract butterflies. Zones: 4-9



Calamintha nepeta

Calamint - 10" – 18" tall. Flower white and hint of blue color with age. Full sun. Blooms from June till frost. Not a favorite of deer. Member of the mint family. A medicinal plant. Shear back ½ plant in Spring to make room for new Spring growth. **In 2021 chosen by the Perennial Plant Assoc. "Plant of the Year". A pollinator that is a favorite of bees. Zones: 5-7**



Echinacea purpurea 'Magnus'

Coneflower - 2'-4 'tall. Flower deep pink-purple. Blooms June to late Summer in full sun. Drought, deer, heat, humidity and poor soil tolerant A cultivar. **In 1998 chosen by the Perennial Plant Assoc. "Plant of the Year"**
Zones: 1-9



Panicum virgatum 'Northwind'

Switchgrasses - 4' – 5' tall. An Ornamental Grass. Full sun to part shade. Season of interest Summer (Early, Mid, Late) Fall and Winter. Olive to blue-green foliage turns golden yellow in autumn. **In 2014 chosen by the Perennial Plant Assoc. "Plant of the Year". Zones: 4-9**



Pennisetum alopecuroides 'Red Head'

Fountain-grasses - 3'-4' tall. Red-hued bottle brush blooms. In full sun to part shade. Seasons of interest, Summer (Early, Mid, Late) Fall. **Recipient of the prestigious Award of Garden Merit of the Royal Horticulture Society. Zone: 5-9**



Stachys officinalis 'Hummelo'

Betony - 18"– 24" tall. Happy in full sun but tolerate some shade. It is in the Mint fam. Flower rosy lavender color from July to early September. Deadhead to keep flowering twice. Leave sturdy stem because it adds texture in the garden and good for pollinators. **In 2019 chosen by the Perennial Plant Assoc. "Plant of the Year". A pollinator magnet and Bee-friendly. Zone: 4-8**



Ilex glabra

Inkberry holly - 5 to 8 feet high. An evergreen with white spring flowers that attract bees for nectar and pollen. Black-blue berries feed birds fall through winter.

Native to North America, both male and female plants create flowers but only a female can set fruit, with a male near by

Zone: 4-11
